The Commission could "Ctrl F" to find references to "activities undertaken at a premises" and review whether they need to be changed. Depending on DEW's final determination on the REPS Code, the Code may need to reflect a household sub target – currently it only reflects a PG sub target. Other typos/errors in the draft: 4.4.3 tries to merge two REES Code clauses - 5.4.2 and 5.4.3 - but it does not operate well. Also the reference to the current Energy Industry Guideline No 6 will be out of date when the guideline is revised i.e. it will be No. 7.

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
