I believe that the Code should continue to mandate street light repair obligations and an obligation of SA Power Networks to make Guaranteed Service Level (GSL) payments for delayed repairs. Many individuals may consider it not worth the effort to report faulty street lights unless there was the obligation for the repair of faulty lights to be undertaken in a timely fashion, with cash incentives for SA Power Networks to not unduly delay repairs by SA Power Networks making GSL payments to the individuals who first reported the faulty lights. I do not accept arguments that because street lights are more reliable than in the past, that aspect of the distribution code should be removed. The street light repair obligations help provide incentives for the public to report faulty street lights and minimise delays to the repairs of street lights.	
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
